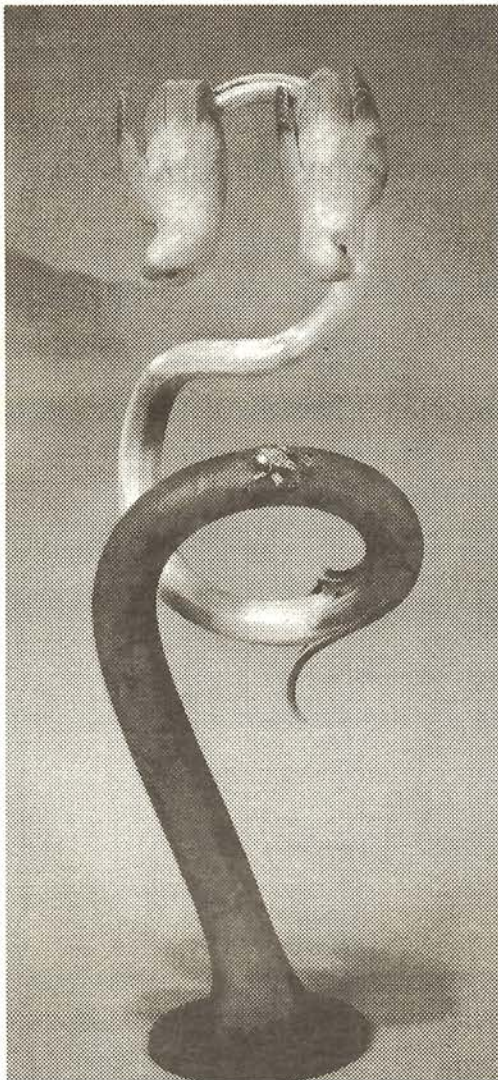

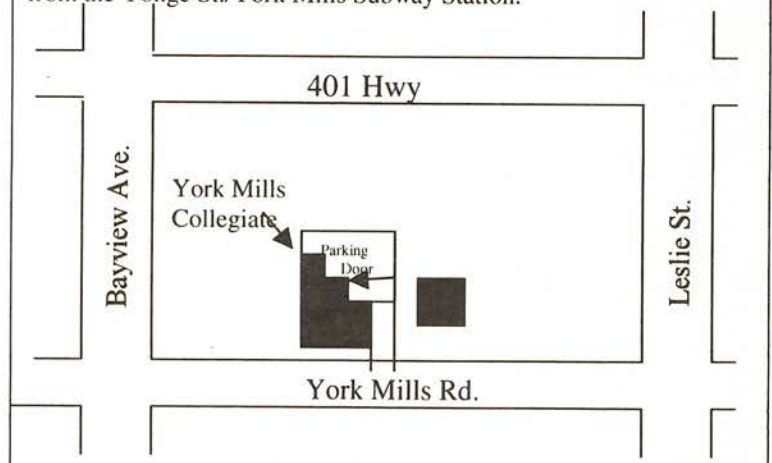

## From your editor:



Another successful OWCA show with over 250 competitive entries. While I slice and gouge away I don't claim to be a carver. And if I am ever tempted to claim some artistic ability I remember my walk past the display of novice entries. I have the privilege of seeing the 42 winning carvings up close during the photography session. I

hold each carving (including a totem of over six feet and a huge framed mirror) and so examine them more closely than 95% of show attendees. I have the opportunity to really appreciate the work and skill devoted to each entry. I solicited comments from each of the judges and include an abbreviation. Our thanks go to Natasha Koumayan for this year's fine photos of all the winners appearing in this issue. Congratulations to all those awarded a ribbon and to all those who entered the competition. I would have been proud to produce any one of the entries.

### Cover

The cover carving by Lindsay Ontario's Craig Hutton is from a single 10"x16"x36" tupelo base. The pair of peach-faced lovebirds eyeing an African flower beetle is displayed on a cleverly carved looped branch. Thirty-year old Craig started carving about 10 years ago and has been concentrating on birds for the last five years. It is one of those entries that the more closely you examine it the more you appreciate the carving.

### Judges Comments

"The quality, variety and sheer size of the OWCA Show made it the most difficult and demanding that I have ever judged," commented Dorsey James. Neil Cox felt that: "The most important aspects of a carving competition are: the chance to mingle with other carvers, learning from each other and examining the displayed workmanship. A competition encourages each participant to make that extra effort in their work." Al Glassford believed: "The bird entries were a little weak. In wood-burning the small but superb lion's head was almost overlooked in the selection of best-of-level open. Reiterating that we must be careful not to let size influence judging." "The best-in-show carving was subtle and had to be examined to appreciate the combination of composition, complexity and technical execution," explained Dave Johnson. Dave also said the

Masters category "clearly demonstrated that wood, as an artistic medium, can support artistic expression and technical merit as well as or better than any other artists medium."

All judges agreed that the selection of best-of-level in novice was the most difficult choice.

The judges were encouraged seeing many new carvers participating reflecting the stream of new talent involved in the art of carving and wood burning. All judging is a subjective procedure and competitors should always remember that the competition produced many excellent creations.

## 2001 Canadian Wildlife Carving Championships

Wye Marsh Centre, Midland, Ontario

Hosted by the Wye Marsh Association of Woodcarvers and supported by the Wye Marsh Wildlife Center, the September 29 and 30, 2001 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Wildlife Carving Championships was deemed by all involved, a well-organized quality event.

Since 1999 this competition has grown at a steady pace, from 86 carvers to 106 and from 191 carvings to 256 carvings. With a new category, "Gunning Decoy," hopefully further growth will be seen at next year's competition.

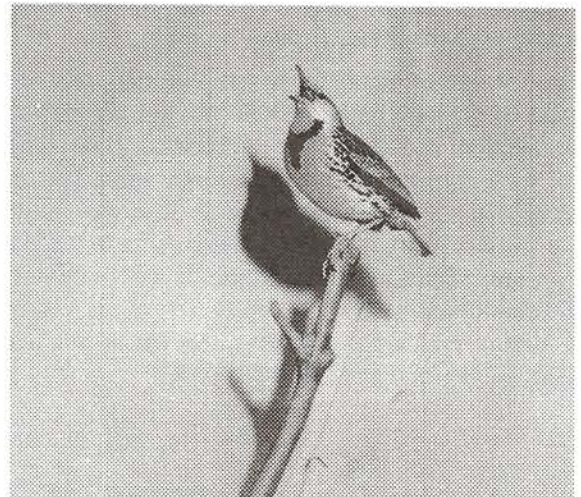
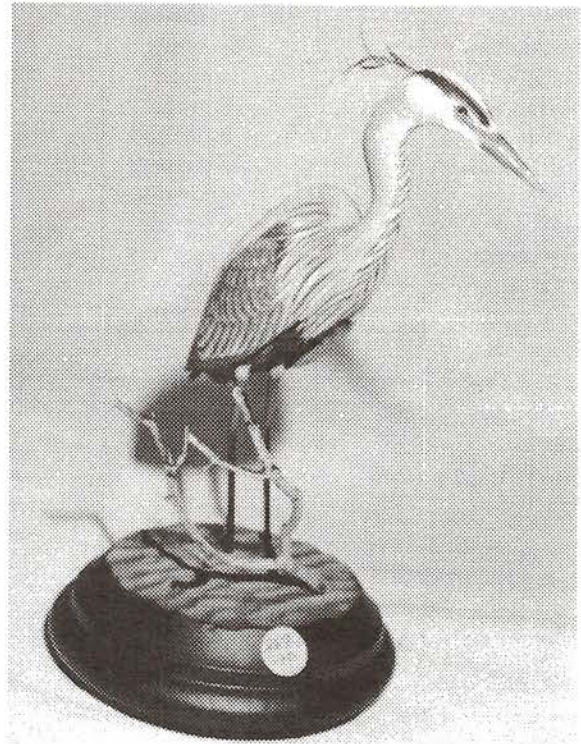
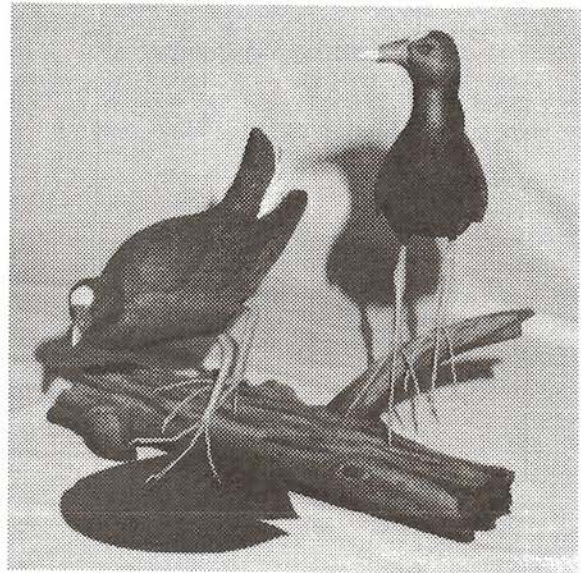
Some of the highlights of this year's show:
